The Forest in Spring

Aigas Community Forest offers ideal grounds to many wildlife species, especially in spring. Golden and whitetailed eagles have been seen high above and peregrine falcons fly over occasionally. Buzzards and red kites are often circling above and the first ospreys were seen back in the area in early April.

Summer migrant birds keep on returning and singing loudly in the carpark and around the forest, including chiffchaff, willow warbler and blackcaps. We have just heard first cuckoos' well known tune. St Tiburtius' Day on 14th April is when cuckoos traditionally start singing, stopping on St John's Day on 24th June.

Comma butterflies, which disappeared from Scotland nearly 150 years ago and have only made a come back in 2004, are regularly sunbathing around the forest. Soon more invertebrates will be seen amongst the carpets of bluebells.

Thrift, wood anemone, ramsons and primrose are all flowering at the moment, especially along Ladies walk -The thinning of trees allows light to come in the forest, which enables these flowers and wildlife coming to life.
